For those who registered for Annual Conference, it would be helpful to know how the technical component works. Our technical support provider, GNTV, provided helpful trainings in



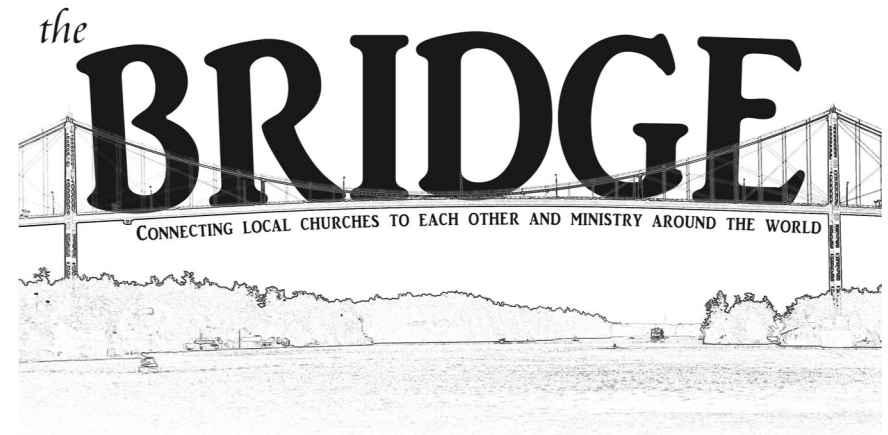
